Since commencing at BSL - Red Energy Arena, I have gained an appreciation for the significance the arena holds for this city and region. 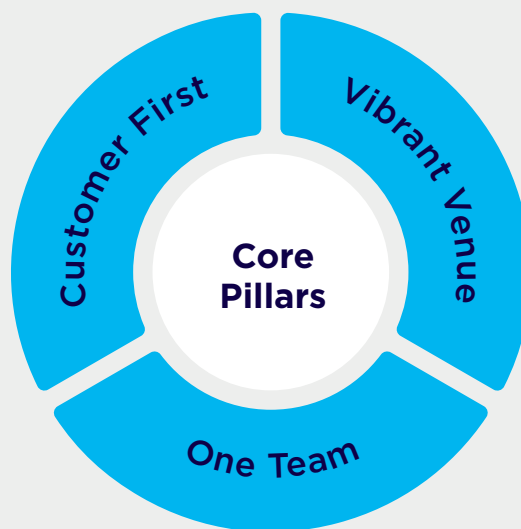
Our People

The past year has been one of significant change and growth for BSL, as we embrace a period of transformation to strengthen our culture, enhance our capabilities and align our people strategy with the organisation's future direction.

A Year of Change

With new leadership and a refreshed organisational structure, we have revised positions and clarified accountabilities to ensure our people are best placed to deliver on our strategic priorities. Central to this work has been embedding a renewed focus on three core pillars:

Building Capability

In addition, we have ensured compliance with evolving industrial requirements. Policies were introduced and revised to reflect legislative changes and best practice.

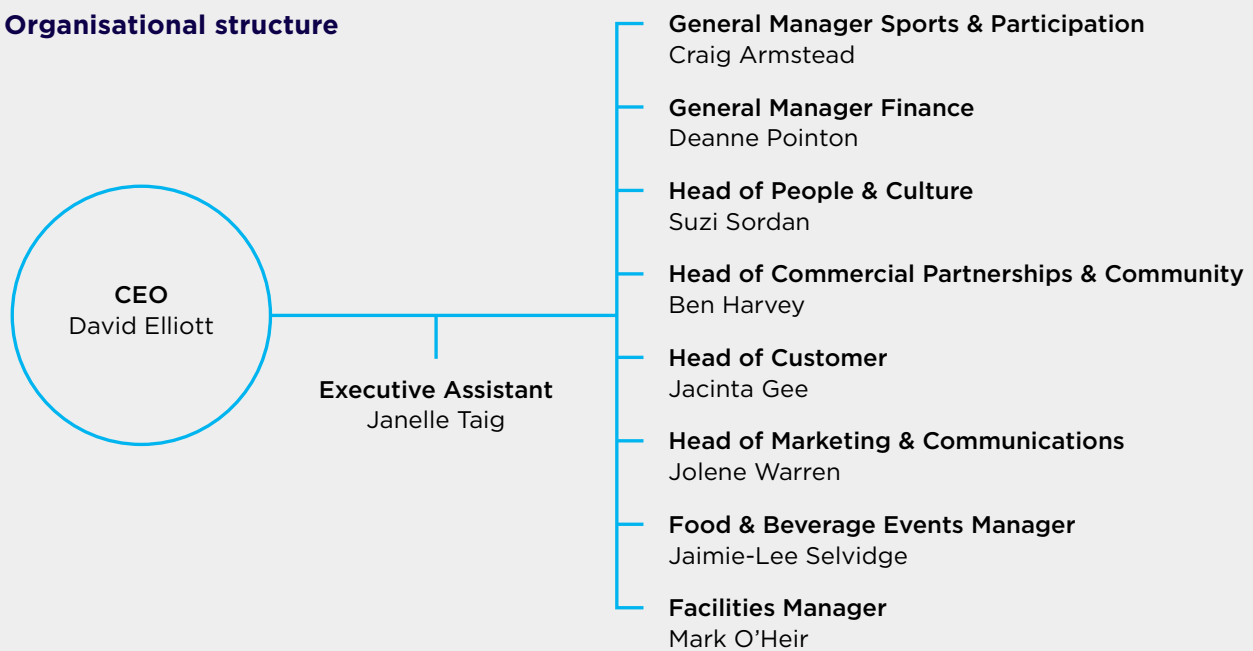
Recognising and Celebrating Our People

Events

Red Energy Arena has been as busy as ever with the venue delivering 169 events in the 2024-25 financial year. Many of these were first-time users of Red Energy Arena, and ranged from one-time events to week-long and beyond using the full facility.

We hosted a variety of large-scale national and international events along with community events and business functions, as well as our regular activity of domestic sports programs.

Some standout events included the Australian Diamonds v England Roses netball, which attracted a sellout crowd. There was also the Bound4Bendigo Melbourne Vixens pre-season game against Waikato Bay of Plenty Magic, with players treating the crowd to a traditional Haka after the game.

Extended multi-day competitions included Basketball Victoria's Junior Country Championships, the Basketball Australia U16 Nationals and the Australian Junior Volleyball Championships. These events are at the core of what we do as a venue and we will continue to seek these events to showcase Red Energy Arena to Australia. We also hosted the Australian Irish Dancing Championships for the first time, a six-day event utilising the full venue.

We continued to diversify our range of events and look outside traditional sports to further commercialise our spaces.

Beyond sport, some other key highlights included hosting Bendigo's two biggest gala dinners, the McKean McGregor Bendigo Community Gala ball and the Be.Bendigo Business Excellence Awards. These transform our basketball arena into a formal ceremony space. Allowing the Bendigo community to gather in such large numbers for a social night is truly memorable.

Community Programs

Agnico Eagle School Reading Program

The Agnico Eagle School Reading Program supports children to build positive relationships through classroom-based activities and on-court practical experiences. This highlights the Bendigo Braves values of teamwork and inclusivity.

The on-going partnership with Agnico Eagle has entered its sixth year. During that time, it has delivered 200+ sessions across 20 schools.

McKern Foundation Fresh Fruit Friday Program

We have been involved in McKern Foundation's Fresh Fruit Friday Program again in 2025. Now in its 10th year, it delivers a weekly supply of fresh fruit to 35 kindergartens, primary and secondary schools in and around Bendigo. Over 13,000 students receive the fruit weekly, making it the region's largest program of its kind.

We are proud to support the program through our Ambassador, Cassidy McLean from Bendigo Braves, along with other Braves' athletes who visits the schools to educate students on healthy living.

The strength of our region's elite basketball pathway was showcased on the international stage, with Bendigo success stories shining at the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris.

Home-grown NBA star Dyson Daniels was among our standout performers as the Australian men reached the quarter finals.

Dyson's selection for the Boomers at the Olympic tournament capped his rise to the international ranks, having taken his first steps as a basketballer here at Red Energy Arena.

After learning the basics in our Biddy Ball and Ford Aussie Hoops programs, he joined the Aztec club before graduating to the Junior Braves, state and national representative teams, NBL1 Braves and the NBA global academy.

Sami Whitcomb enjoyed an outstanding season for the Spirit, leading the club's charge for a first championship since 2013-14.

She was also an outstanding leader off the court, as shown when she delivered some inspiring words to our Bendigo basketball community at our International Women's Day Q&A - hosted by Tess Madgen.

"As a kid, I think you think of success and failure, right?" she told the audience.

"I think the older I've gotten, the more that I can take away so many good things out of something that I would have maybe perceived as a bad.

Thousand-match milestone as community backs basketball

Central Victoria's support for our programs at Red Energy Arena was highlighted in November 2024, when more than a thousand games of community basketball were played within a month.

This milestone was achieved as we continued to see surging numbers of players registering with our local clubs. Over the 2024-25 summer, there were 540 teams registered, up from 489 just two years ago.

A big driver of this growth is a boost in female participation, with 152 teams for women and girls registered for the 2024-25 season.

In total, there are 4,895 players participating, while Fridays are our busiest day of community basketball each week, with 80 matches.

Pickleball finds home at Red Energy Arena

Pickleball is one of the world's fastest growing sports and it now has a new home in Bendigo.

"After running a trial at Red Energy Arena in 2024, it was clear to us that this is the best venue to accelerate our growth," Paul Henshall, BPC President, said.

"The facilities are fantastic for playing pickleball, as well as our members being able to socialise together.

"During the trial we enjoyed a significant increase in the number of new players, many who never played the game before, and are confident this trend will continue."

Food and Beverage

Red Energy Arena and The Borough Club have continued to evolve over the past year. Our teams are embracing the One Team approach, that has further strengthened service delivery and built a culture of consistency and collaboration across all areas.

A clear focus has been placed on the sustainability and strategy of our food and beverage offerings. We continue to refine menus and service styles to meet customer preferences while maintaining high quality. The introduction of the \$9.90 lunch special has been a standout success, with growing patronage and positive feedback making it a core part of our lunchtime service.

Alongside the seven-day operation, the team also manages catering for a wide range of functions and events. From Bendigo Spirit and Braves game days to large scale gala dinners hosting up to 950 guests, the team has shown outstanding adaptability. Their ability to consistently deliver at such a high standard is a credit to their skill, dedication and teamwork.

The canteen has also been an area of strength, playing a crucial role in supporting the venue's hosting of major sporting tournaments. The team has successfully managed high volume service across multi-day events, meeting the demands of large crowds while maintaining speed, quality and efficiency. This operation is vital to the overall event experience and demonstrates the versatility of our food and beverage offering.



The Borough Club

The Borough Club, our Eaglehawk venue, has also experienced success over the past year. While operating on a smaller scale, it provides an important extension of our food and beverage services and offers another point of connection with our community. The Borough Club supports the broader department by sharing resources and providing valuable opportunities for staff development across venues. Its contribution highlights the strength of having multiple outlets working together under the One Team approach.

The combined efforts of the bar and bistro, catering, canteen and Borough Club highlight the scale and professionalism of our hospitality service. From daily service to large events, the team continues to grow, adapt and deliver memorable experiences for all customers.

Facilities and Redevelopment

Facilities management in the sports and events sector has seen a significant evolution in 2025, driven by new technology integration, sustainability, and the demand for improved athlete and fan experiences.

Modern sports venues are no longer just playing fields. They are tech-enabled environments requiring sophisticated management to ensure safety, performance and profitability.

This year has been an exciting time for BSL, with our new strategy ensuring we align with our goals to create better outcomes for our athletes and our community.

The increasing numbers we've seen in community basketball, netball, volleyball and pickleball have us working harder than ever to provide a venue that Bendigo can be proud of.

BSL has been working closely with the City of Greater Bendigo to ensure community sports are played in a safe and clean environment. We are excited to have acquired Swan Hill Stadium, joining St Arnaud Sporting Club and the Borough Club as entertainment destinations under the BSL banner.

Our maintenance strategy has shifted toward a more predictive model, using data analytics and asset management systems to reduce downtime and operational costs. We have also focused on accessibility and inclusivity to make sure our venues are welcoming all fans and participants.

Redevelopment

The major redevelopment at Red Energy Arena has now commenced and will create a bigger, better and more inclusive home for sport, entertainment and our community in Bendigo.

The project is being delivered by Development Victoria on behalf of Sport and Recreation Victoria, as part of the Victorian Government's Regional Sports Infrastructure Program.

This redevelopment will bring the total number of our courts to 12, allowing more community sports to be played more regularly, and more events to be hosted simultaneously – an exciting time for Red Energy Arena.

Over 2025-26, the works will deliver:

- Two brand-new indoor courts for more local and regional competitions.
- Refurbishment of two existing courts to elevate the experience for athletes and spectators.
- New lighting for outdoor netball courts to make evening games safer and more accessible.
- Sustainability upgrades including solar panels, a back-up generator and improved utilities.
- Carpark and accessibility improvements to make visiting easier for everyone.
